#### **INVICTUS**

« Beyond this place of wrath and tears Looms but the Horror of the shade, And yet the menace of the years Finds and shall find me unafraid.

It matters not how strait the gate, How charged with punishments the scroll, I am the master of my fate: I am the captain of my soul » <sup>1</sup>

For his second solo exhibition at the Félix Frachon Gallery, Dimitri Fagbohoun explores the theme of resilience in his opus Invictus.

He took the eponymous poem written in 1888 by William Ernest Henley as a starting point for his reflection. The artist retains its sacred and universal character, a recurring theme in his work. The notions of possession, domination, but also of surpassing oneself and conquering freedom are at the heart of his research. The dialogue, between the legacies of a colonial past and forces of resistance, opens the way to a reading free of antagonisms:

How can we atone for the past, overcome the collective trauma and write a common future?

«Why all these deaths in the middle of colonial Africa? Why this incomprehensible oblivion? This silence, that nothing or so little disturbs? The facts, however historical, took place in full view of all, decided in the heart of a conscious, documented and active Europe. Everything has been written, read, denounced, proven, argued. At no time was it possible to ignore it, even out of courtesy».<sup>2</sup>

# «I am the Captain of my soul»

- Willyam Ernest Henley

In the continuity of Recollection's corpus in which he was interested in the influence of the so-called «Negro» arts in the history of Western art, the artist here questions the ambitions of one man to the detriment of thousands of others.

Faithful to his universe, the colour black predominates in new forms. Drawings, made with gold powder, evoke black cruises and the exploitation of copper mines. Like spirits, evanescent silhouettes, born of a single fleeting gesture, appear on paper.

While the ceramic bust of the sovereign, the eternal figure of the father, looks today at yesterday's history, the oppressed man, Nkissi, «stung» by life, continues to walk, carried by a freedom-loving spirit towards a new world that offers itself to him. Like Invictus (undefeated), he comes out strengthened by the trials he has gone through.

Resulting from an ongoing process, between personal interpretation and exploration of our collective memory, Dimitri Fagbohoun offers a peaceful look at history. The Invictus exhibition brings together sensitive works of universal significance, because whatever happens, «I am the captain of my soul. »

Born in 1972 in Benin Lives and works between Paris, Brussels and Cotonou.

Dimitri Fagbohoun was born in July 1972 from a Beninese father and an Ukrainian mother in Cotonou, Benin. Having grown up in Cameroon before moving to France where he now lives and works, the themes and questions he works on reflect his background and history, between geographical and artistic boundaries.

His work is inseparable from his own experience and his plural identity. He uses different forms like sculpture, video, photography, installation and drawings for the first time at the Félix Frachon Gallery. He expresses a relationship to identities and history in which his writing disturbs the models that constitute them.

Since 2015, he has been questioning classical (African) works of art that have influenced Western art .

In 2017, he received «the Smithsonian Fellowship Award» from the Smithsonian National Museum of African Art in Washington D.C for his project: «recollection» which was exhibited at the Félix Frachon Gallery the same year. The artist is now part of prestigious foundations like Foundation Sindika Dokolo in Angola or Foundation Moleskine and Benetton in Italy.



## PREVIOUS EXHIBITION AT THE FELIX FRACHON GALLERY

#### 2017 Recollection, Felix Frachon Gallery, Brussels, Belgium

« When, after the London museum , the Louvre museum will receive the Negro art, it will not find its complement, but its principle.»

(Lucie Cousturier quoted by Félix Fénon in « Surveys of the distant arts: will they be admitted to the Louvre, Bulletin of artistic life, 1920)

Recollection is the recognition of this principle which makes it possible to apprehend both the physical processes of the works and the processes of cultural and artistic capturing

which surround them. Because of their fascination with the Western world, discoveries of these « distant arts » were mainly apprehended under the prism of the influence they had on the great artistic movements of the 20th century.

Dimitri Fagbohoun engages a reflection that transcends the borders previously defined to open new perspectives. It is this work of memory, this return to oneself which is at the heart of the artist's work and which testifies to his initial intention: to define a corpus of masterpieces of African Art from the traditional universe and now recognized as 'classical' in order to reclaim.

Through various medium, Dimitri Fagbohoun creates an intimate but eloquent speech affirming the power of artistic language. Between filiation and legacy, Recollection thus invites the viewer to a deep journey, but whose scope is undoubtedly universal. A journey that translates subtly the evolution of function, form, use and ultimate value of the work of art.













